

Thank you for stopping in to view activities. I explain ahead of reading that I want children to act as bears. So after I read the bear line, the children make bear claw hands and say “Grrr!” They can also come up with their own gestures for the other animals to be more interactive. The template for the **tear bear** is provided here. I printed out the template and glued to a piece of construction paper for background. Then children can tear pieces of black and brown construction paper to cover the template.



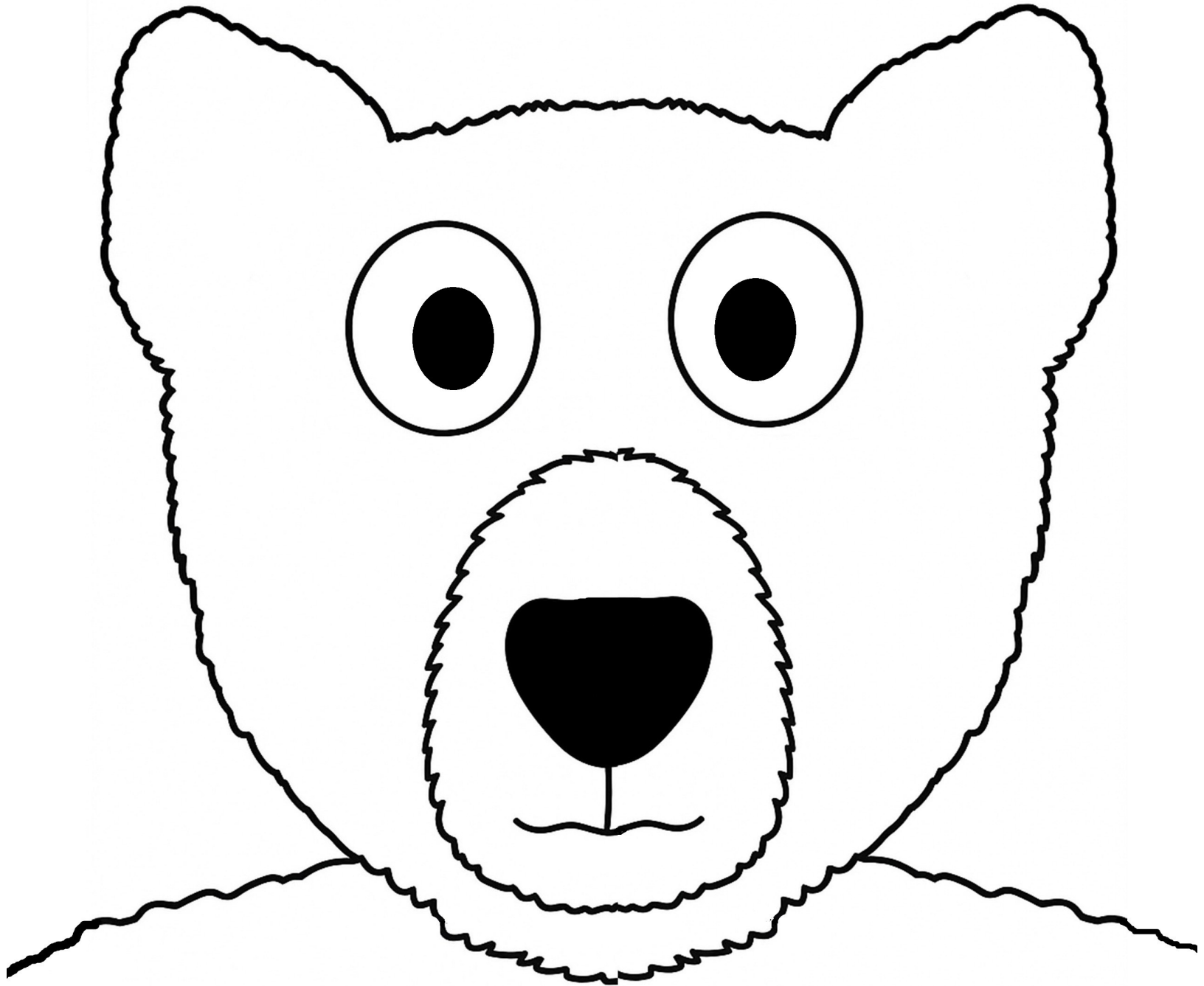
I used cardstock for this one to keep it stiff on the large popsicle stick.
